ProGit

- Create project easily
- Easy to use
- Fork projects
- Create / Merge pull-request
- Project's documentations
- Issue tracker
- Git-centered
- "Move out"



Progit – Specs

- Python based
- Flask application
- Git integration: pygit2



ProGit – 2 weeks

- FAS integrated
- Git-centered view (cgit-like)
- Git-based doc: rst/markdown/html
- Basic issue-tracking system
- Basic fork/pull-request/merge mechanism
 - Across projects



ProGit - Today

- \sim 4,500 LOC (including hooks)
- 2 working hooks
 - Email
 - ProGit hook (relates #1; fixes #2)
 - IRC hook (structure)
- Easy to create projects
- Project's settings for doc and tracker



ProGit - Today (2)

- Supports Fork / Pull-request / Merging
 - Across and within a project
- Gitolite integration (for auth)
- Distributed issue-tracking system



ProGit Today (3)

The missing pieces:

- Anonymous cloning (git clone git://..., to update feature branch?)
- Improve UI / UX
- Dedicated / Documented API
 - Compatible with GitHub's?
- Comments on pull-requests
